

Cherry Hill Swim Club

Rules

- Adult Supervision - Adults are responsible for the supervision of their own children and cleaning their area before they leave the pool. Please place your trash in a garbage can and see that your children do the same.
- Consideration of others - The pool is a place to relax and have fun and we are requesting the members to be considerate of others.
- Food - You may bring your own food and drinks to the pool. However, you cannot bring any glass containers to the pool due to safety reasons. *State regulations prohibit glass containers as well as food or drinks being consumed in or within the white painted line of the pool.*
- Rafts - For safety reasons, only single person rafts will be allowed in the pool. They must not obstruct the view of the lifeguard. No diving through or jumping onto inflatable rafts from the side of the pool. Rafts will not be allowed in the pool when it is too crowded.
- Adult Swim - Must be 18 years or older to swim during adult swim. The only exception to this rule is for staff members.
- Diapers - Children who are not completely toilet trained must wear swim diapers. No disposable diapers are permitted.
- Swimmies/Swim Bubbles - Infants wearing floatation devices are not permitted in deep swim well.
- Swim Attire - Proper swim attire must be worn at all times with the intent of the facility to be a family oriented facility. Cherry Hill reserves the right to deny access to the pool or other areas due to inappropriate dress.
- Skin Conditions - Cherry Hill can refuse admission or expel from the water anyone having a contagious disease, infectious condition such as colds, fever, ringworm, foot infections, skin lesions, boils, inflamed eyes, ear discharges or any condition which has the appearance of being infectious.
- Membership Cards - No one will be permitted into the swim club without valid membership card or paid guest fee. Membership card will be returned to owner upon leaving the club. Lost membership cards will be replaced with a \$1.00 replacement fee.

Pool Etiquette

- No running. No dunking. No pushing. No towel snapping. No boisterous or rough play.
- No hanging on lap lanes or ropes.
- Sponge or beach balls are allowed in shallow end only (no hard, rubber or tennis balls).
- No person under the influence of alcohol or drugs should use the pool.
- No spitting or blowing your nose in the pool.
- No animals or pets allowed in the pool or on pool property.
- No glass allowed in the pool or on the deck.
- No child under the age of 12 may be at the pool at any time unattended by an adult.
- A first aid kit is located in the hut. An emergency phone is located in the hut.
- Contact the manager on duty if there is any incident involving a member or guest of the pool.
- Lifeguards shall determine who is acting inappropriately and may require any member or guest acting inappropriately to leave the pool or pool area.

Diving Board Rules

- Use the ladder to get on the diving board.
- Only one diver is allowed on the board at a time
- Sitting on the guardrails is prohibited.
- Multiple bouncing on diving board is prohibited. One bounce only on board.
- Dive off the front of the board only. Must dive or jump straight out from board.
- After going off the board, swim to the ladder and exit immediately.
- No one is permitted on the diving board ladder while board is in use.
- No diving until the previous diver has reached the pool ladder.
- Hands must enter the water first in headfirst dives.
- No horseplay allowed.
- No balls in the diving well.
- Do not hang on gutters and/or ropes in deep end.
- Swimming under the board toward the back wall is not allowed.
- Goggles are not permitted while using the diving board.
- No floatation devices may be worn when going off the board.
- Food or drinks of any kind are not permitted while using the diving board.
- **No non-swimmers permitted on the board. Children will be required to take swim test across the width of the dive well. Parents are not allowed to catch children from board.**

Rules are set in place for the safety of all divers and swimmers by the American Red Cross, pool management, and our wonderful insurance companies. Everyone can enjoy the pool if mutual respect is given to each member or guest. Any problems interfering with the enjoyment of the pool should be brought to the attention of the pool manager. The decision of management in response to such problem shall be final.
